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# Why are you here today?

You or your organization has a vested interest in the health of Kansans, providing health coverage for the uninsured and in funding your programs.

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Working in collaboration can result in lowered health care costs, decrease in the potential loss of life, more productivity and lower absenteeism rate for workers.

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The Kansas Cancer Partnership has developed a budget of \$61 million to address cancer in Kansas- this includes prevention activities, screening and treatment and community projects.

# Of the \$61 million—

- \$18 million is dedicated to tobacco prevention and cessation efforts
- \$33 million will be directed to cancer screening and treatment for the uninsured
- \$10 million is dedicated to research, education, public information and community projects



# Collaboration

- The CCC Partnership recognizes the need to collaborate with other organizations interested in chronic disease.
- Many community projects in the cancer budget will benefit other chronic disease prevention efforts.
